Holy Cross Raises \$28,000 Through Give Local Campaign

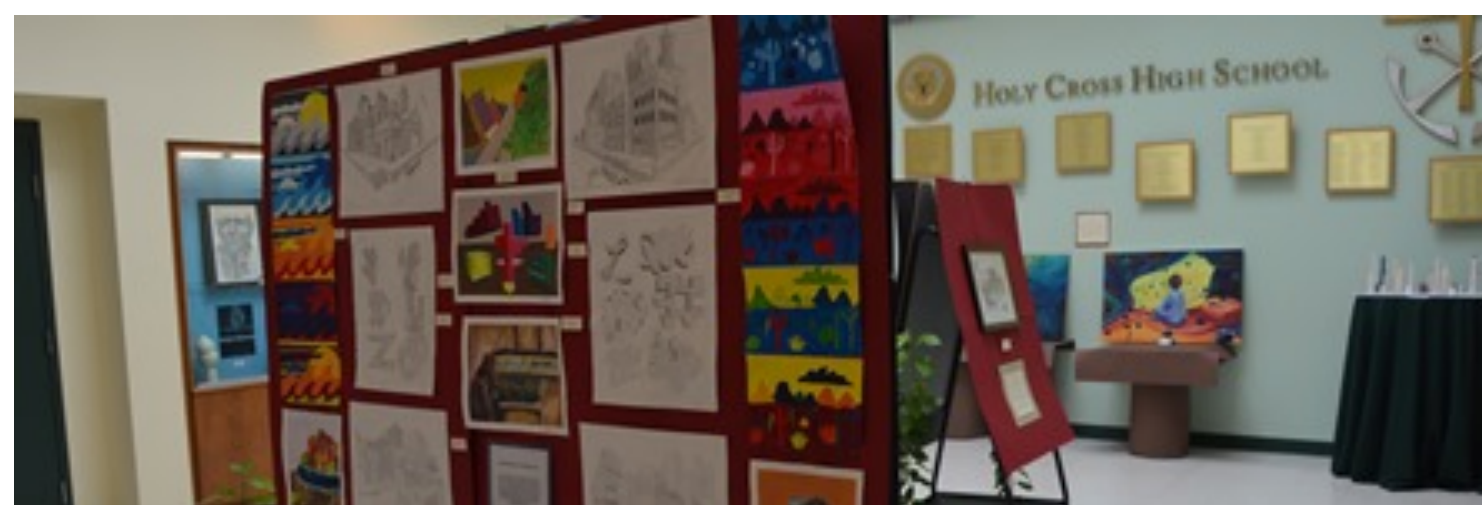
